*This month, Yuba Sutter Arts is showcasing the wondrous works of William (Bill) Abel. Abel displays a vibrant interpretation of how he sees life in his show "Fever Dream."*

*Born in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, Bill Abel decided to pursue the life of an artist at the age of fourteen. He moved to Venice, California in the late 1960s to get away from the cold harsh climate. Bill later moved north to the Bay Area, and finally settled in Berry Creek where living in the peaceful solitude of the forest allows himself to stay focused on completing his work.*

*"Fever Dream" will be displayed at Yuba Sutter Arts for the month of August. A "Meet the Artist Reception" will be held on Friday, August 9 from 5 - 7pm in the Gallery at Yuba Sutter Arts, 624 E Street in Marysville. All are invited to attend this free special event. Refreshments will be served. The exhibit is on display until August 30.*

*Bill Abel recognizes the subject of surrealism as defined by Dr. Anna Balakian. "The objective of surrealism is the infinite expansion of reality as a substitute for a previously accepted dichotomy between the real and the imaginary." Such expressions were derived from works such as Salvador Dali and René Magritte who made their styles reflect the juxtaposition of previous artists, however the term surrealism was first used to describe Pablo Picasso's ballet "Parade."*

*Abel, as a self-taught painter, started by copying works of master artists. Using the skills he learned, along with others obtained from his former job as a sign painter, he adopted his style to his own variation of surrealism. Abel has been painting this way since the early 80's and feels comfortable with how his mind coincides with his work. He sees surrealism as holding more truth to life than logic does most of the time.*

*As Abel carries on painting, his work is ever evolving making him continuously popular among artists and observers alike.*

The harvested rice field and grasslands surrounding Sutter Buttes provide excellent foraging habitat for these living dinosaurs. Light rain will not deter us from this great trip. This hike has a difficulty level of 3 (lots of driving and walking on mostly flat ground).*

*Be sure to bring binoculars, if you have them.*

*Meet at Swan Central and carpool to West of Live Oak. Duration of this tour is 2.5 hours and driving is 10 miles each way.*

*This is a rare opportunity to look for birds across Beale Air Force Base's 23,000 acres. Department of Defense facilities preserve some of the best remaining habitats in the U.S. and Beale is a great example. The base includes one of the largest and best preserved areas of Central Valley grassland, a habitat under severe threat from urban development and conversion to agriculture elsewhere. Two base biologists will accompany us as we search the grasslands for Burrowing Owls, Ferruginous and Rough-legged Hawks, and other raptor species, and most likely either Bald or Golden Eagles. Falcons likely will include American Kestrel, Merlin, Peregrine and Prairie Falcon. Horned Larks, Mute Swans and Western Meadowlarks should be abundant. Surprises like Mountain Bluebirds, tricolored blackbirds or Stellar's Jays are also possible this time of year. We will also visit some large ponds that can harbor several species of waterfowl and an oak riparian zone with its own suite of typical species like Acorn and Lewis's woodpeckers. Participants will caravan from Swan Central to the main gate of the base. After being checked in base security, everybody will get into one large passenger van, so we can travel around the base together. There will be a number of stops on base, including several short walks on flat ground. If there's enough time, we may drive by some other points of interest on the base, including an SR71 Blackbird strategic reconnaissance aircraft that flew over Mach 3 to the UK in 2 hours! Difficulty level is 2 (birding by car and walking)*

*Important note: To gain access to the base, each adult participant must provide their full name birth date and driver's license number (including state of issuance).*

*Participants over the age of 16 must have a current photo ID to show base security personnel. The driver of each vehicle entering the base must provide current vehicle registration and proof of insurance.*

*Be sure to bring your photo ID, driver's license and registration, if you are driving and binoculars.*

*Meet at Swan Central and carpool to Beale Air Force Base. Duration of this tour is 4.5 hours and driving is 10 miles each way.*
